School vision statement

At Adaminaby Public School we strive to provide a broad range of experiences and learning opportunities within a practical, innovative and flexible curriculum that will engage and motivate all students to learn, discover and apply their knowledge within their school day and continuing to be a life long learner and critical and creative thinker into the future.

School context

Adaminaby Public School is a one teacher school in the Snowy Mountains, situated 54km from Cooma. It is a small school which provides a wide range of experiences in all key learning areas with a emphasis on developing literacy and numeracy skills. The school provides education for students drawn predominately from the rural areas of the northern Monaro.

School planning process

Community consultation has occurred in the planning process. The community was invited to a focus session at the school to identify future priorities for the planning cycle. Consultation with AECG president (Craig Dixon) has occurred and will continue throughout cycle. Regular and ongoing meetings with staff have taken place to establish the future directions of the school.
