School background 2018–2020

School vision statement

School context

Broadwater Public School is a small PP5 school locatedwithin the village of Broadwater in the Lismore School Education Group. Theschool has strong links with the surrounding small schools.

The school is staffed by a Teaching Principal, twofull–time classroom teachers, a part–time teacher–librarian and a Learning and Support Teacher (0.1). Other staffing include a shared School Administrative Manager position (1.0) and a general assistant.

The school and community partnership remains strong withour core body of P&C helpers eager to promote our educational programs and student achievement. Our staff actively promote opportunities for parents towork as partners in our school.

School planning process

A review of the 2015–2017 school plan wasconducted by staff to determine those initiatives which were successful andthose which didn't meet expectations. Ananalysis of 2016–2017 NAPLAN data was also undertaken which, along with schoolassessment data, was used to identify school performance in Literacy andNumeracy.

The P&C were asked to share their ideas and thoughtson how they perceive our schools' to be progressing and discussion was heldaround this. Members completed a short survey to identify any big picture ideasthey had for the next 3 years.

Our senior class and parents participated in the "TellThem From Me" survey for both students and parents. Nine surveys from 30families were returned. The suggestionsfrom our students and school community were collated and analysed. One pointwas that parents would like to be informed about their child's class on a moreregular basis.

Through the surveys, staff meetings and general discussions staff were able to share their ideas and discuss feedback from our school community.
