School background 2018–2020

School vision statement

Girilambone Public School's vision is to provide every child the opportunity to engage in quality learning experiences to achieve their potential which will develop respectful and successful life long learners. A strong network of partner schools will support staff and student learning to provide a culture of evidence based practice and collaboration within and beyond the community.

School context

Girilambone Public School on the traditional lands of the Wongaibon people and is situated within the Bogan Shire and belongs to the Mitchell Schools Network. Girilambone is a TP1 school with a current enrolment of 10 students with 50% of the population identifying as Aboriginal. Girilambone's local centre is Nyngan which is a distance of 45km away. Our school is supported by the Nyngan AECG as well as the Girilambone Public School P&C Association as well as the Girilambone, Hermidale and Marra Creek Leading and Learning Hub.

The school is well resourced with excellent facilities for its students; including a well–resourced library, Stephanie Alexander Kitchen and Garden, covered playground equipment and large open playground areas. Girilambone school has a focus on quality student outcomes in literacy, numeracy and engagement. Students have access to a broad range of activities. from performing arts, cultural, leadership, sporting, environmental and academic pursuits.

School planning process

In term 3 2017 a school survey was sent conducted to gather information from key stake holders of the

success of programs already offered at the school and to seek direction for the school for the following three years. Surveys were slow to return so I enlisted the help of the school captains to interview each parent to complete the survey.

This information was correlated to formulate three strategic directions.

The directions are:

- 1. Student learning and Professional Practice
- 2. School Community Engagement

These directions articulate the school's priorities for quality teaching and learning, quality relationships and systems. Each strategic directions provides details of the purpose, people and processes, products and practices that will be implemented through this plan ensuring a culture of educational excellence.

Practices

Teachers work collaboratively across the Hub to increase student cohort and strengthen professional practice.

The school takes a creative approach to use of the physical environment to ensure that it optimizes learning, within the constraints of the school design and setting.

The school demonstrates a high performance culture, with a clear focus on student progress and achievement and high quality service delivery.

All students have collaboratively developed personalised learning plans with a schedule for review meetings.

These personal learning plans show clear progression in the areas of literacy and numeracy.

Systems are in place to evaluate school and hub systems and processes ensuring they are delivering anticipated benefits and change as requires.
