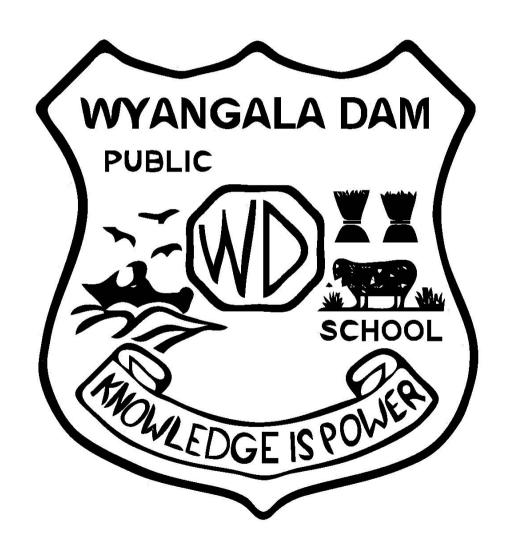

School vision statement

School context

Wyangala Dam Public School is situated 40kms east of Cowra on the Lachlan River. The school has been operating since 1929 and currently five students are enrolled at the school, being all the children in the community.

In 2018, three teaching staff and two support staff support all students in their learning. Students are provided individualised learning opportunities by the dedicated teaching and support staff.

Students connect with their community through initiatives operating from the school.

School planning process

Wyangala Dam Public School, along with its P&C, is a focal point of the town and engages with the community as part of the annual planning process. Input is gathered from teaching and support staff, students, the P&C, and community members to guide the planning process.
