Kemblawarra Public School is a vibrant primary school committed to delivering excellence in education for students across all levels, including preschool, mainstream, and support classes. Proudly affiliated with the Warrawong Community of Schools and nestled in the picturesque Illawarra region, our school is named after the fusion of Port Kembla and Warrawong, forming the unique identity of Kemblawarra Public School.

With an enrolment of 114 K-6 students and an additional 35 Support Class students, our diverse community encompasses learners from various backgrounds and abilities. Our preschool program, catering to up to an additional 80 students, operates on a 5-day fortnight enrolment system. Currently, we boast 5 Mainstream classes, 5 Support Classes, and 2 Preschool Classes, with 60 Aboriginal students enriching our K-6 student body.

At Kemblawarra Public School, our primary focus is to uphold a culture of excellence, embracing best practices and innovative teaching methodologies across all aspects of our educational journey. Through collaborative efforts among staff, parents, and students, we are committed to providing every learner with opportunities for academic success and personal growth.
